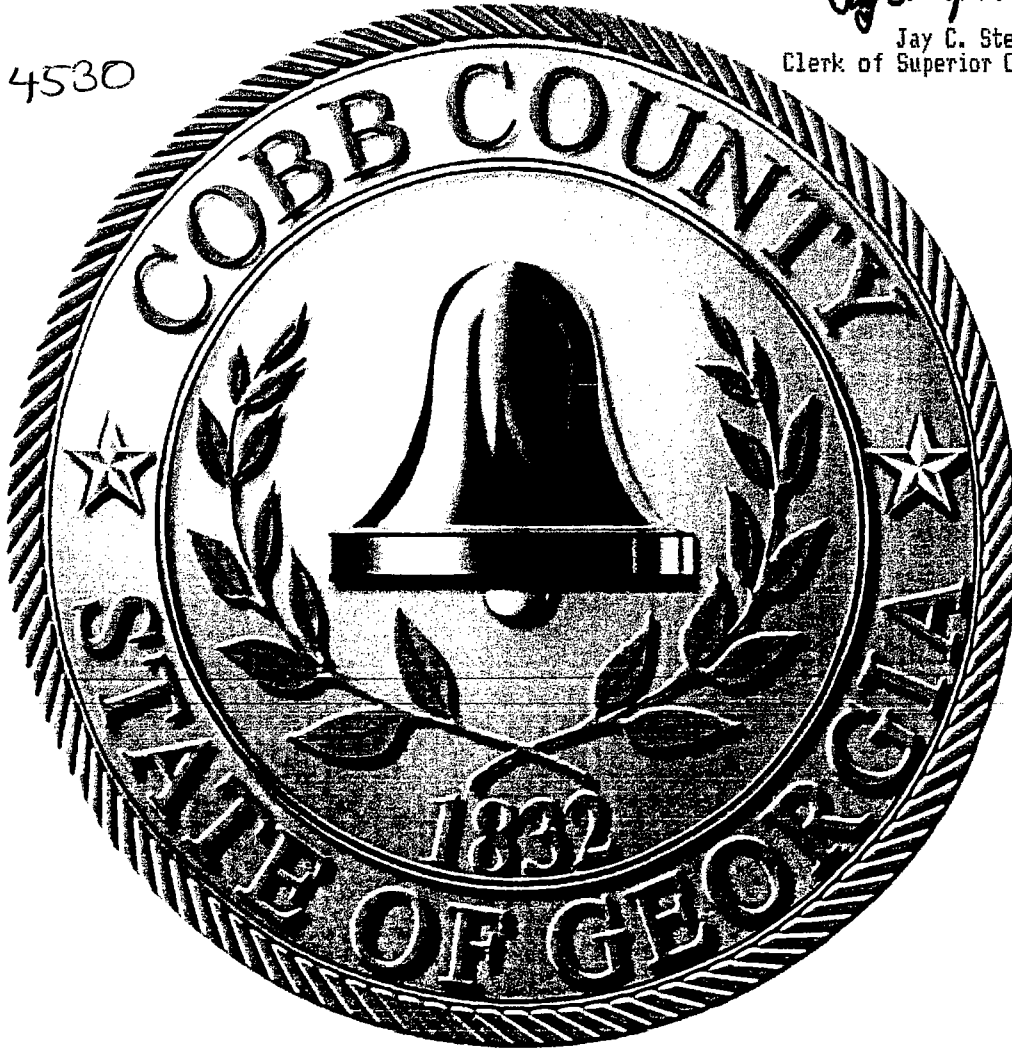

We, the Grand Jury, selected and sworn for the July/August 2006 Term, respectfully make the following presentments:

This Grand Jury has acted on **379** Indictments, returning **373** True Bills and **6** No Bills during the term.

COBB COUNTY GRAND JURY REPORTS

Findings from the Inspection of:

COBB COUNTY BOARD OF ELECTIONS

Report Summary

The committee members decided to review the two main buildings that make up the Cobb County Board of Elections and Registration. The main building is located at 736 Whitlock Avenue, Suite 400 in Marietta, Georgia. This building was recently renovated and occupied by the Board of Elections in January of 2006. Sharon Dunn, Director, Elections and Registration provided the committee with the following overview of her department:

- Ms. Dunn's department consists of 16 full-time staff employees and 125 part-time employees. The number of part-time employees increases to 200 during a Presidential Election year. The staff manages the approximately 400,000 registered voters in Cobb County.
- The annual budget for the department is between \$2-3 million during an election year and \$1-1.5 million during an off election year- there are very few years when no elections take place.
- Ms. Dunn was appointed as the Director, Elections and Registrations in 1981.
- The Board of Elections and Registration is charged with the following:
 - Taking in campaign disclosures
 - Running the Absentee ballot program
 - Making sure the polling locations (191 locations in Cobb County) have supplies and the necessary equipment to run an election
 - Ensuring 100% true election results
- The Board of Elections is governed by a 5 member non-partisan board that serves four year staggered terms. The Director of Elections and Registration is appointed by the board. This Board was created in 1994 and is responsible for setting policy, etc.

- The Cobb County Board of Elections is constantly planning for each election and must follow all State and Federal laws. It was clear that Ms. Dunn and her team were extremely aware of the laws and were proactive in adapting to any changes that might occur.
- The Board also handles all absentee voting- 25,000 Cobb County residents voted absentee in the 2004 Presidential elections. Votes are not counted until 7:00 pm the night of the election.
- Advanced voting was used for the first time in the 2004 Presidential election.
- Advanced voting opens 1 week prior to the election and was held in five polling stations in Cobb County. 25,000 people voted in the first week of the 2004 Presidential election and 5,000 voted in the 2006 primary. Just like with Absentee ballots, the advanced voting results are not calculated until 7:00 pm the night of the election.

Summary-Cobb County Voting Machines

- Machines are mandated by the State
- The State will buy a certain number and the County is responsible for buying any additional machines over and above the number allocated by the State
- In 2002 new voting machines were purchased- these machines use the voter access card technology
- The Department displayed the great care that goes into securing these machines and making sure that they are accurate
- Only two people are authorized to program the machines
- The Department has many safeguards in place to ensure accuracy:
 - Logic and Accuracy testing is completed and after it is verified the machines are sealed with a serial number. The poll workers verify the seal is intact before they can be used. If the seal is broken the machines must be sent back to be re-certified/sealed.
- The County has approximately 2,100 voting machines.
- After the machines are used they go into a 30 day lock down period after each election. If there is a run-off, the extra machines will be put into place.
- Cobb County was the first county in Georgia to use a cable with a padlock to secure the machines.

Poll Workers:

- Poll workers are voluntary. They must go through a 3 hour training class before they can be approved to work an election.

Cobb County Preparation Center

- This building was first occupied in 2002
- All of the voting machines are stored in this building
- Two full-time people manage the building, along with a certain number of part-time workers at any given time
- Logic and accuracy testing is completed at this facility
- Supplies for the polling locations are also stored here and staged for pick-up before elections
- The building has full security cameras that can be viewed from off-site locations

- The building must be humidity controlled, although the building currently does not have central air-conditioning

Conclusions

- The committee was impressed with the organization of the Cobb County Board of Elections. It is clear that the team is dedicated to making sure the County runs fair and efficient elections. The voting machines are state-of-the-art and are kept in great condition and are guaranteed to be accurate.

Recommendations

- Review the possibility of equipping the preparation center with air-conditioning to make it a better place to work and to make sure the voting machines are in a humidity controlled environment.
- Review the possibility of equipping the preparation center with a back-up generator in case of a power loss, especially if it was during an election period.
- It was clear that Ms. Dunn's department could use an additional full-time employee to help alleviate the need for so much over-time and will help make future elections run much better.

Findings from the inspection of:

COBB COUNTY ADULT DETENTION FACILITY

Scope:

Twenty-four (24) members of the Grand Jury of Cobb County inspected the facility and operations of the Cobb County Adult Detention Facility located on County Services Parkway in Marietta, Georgia on July 18, 2006. Meeting with members of the staff and an inspection of the facility began at approximately 12:30 pm. A well-balanced lunch was first served to the jurors. This lunch was similar to dinners served to the inmates. A tour was then held after lunch and concluded at approximately 3:30 pm.

Specifically, the Grand Jury inspected the infirmary, inmate intake area, visitation areas and a general detention area.

General Facts regarding the Facility:

The current level of staffing includes approximately 700 persons of which 414 are sworn officers, 227 civilians, and 59 part-time employees. The annual budget of the facility is approximately \$51.4 million. Approximately 72,500 inmates go through this facility annually. It currently houses nearly 2500 inmates at a cost of approximately \$43 per day/per inmate.

The original detention facility was expanded to 684 beds in 1987 at a cost of \$14 million. An additional \$32 million expansion was completed in 1992 to bring the total number of available beds to 1925. Ground breaking for an additional expansion to increase the facility by 1200 beds will begin early next

year. A recent voter approved Special Purpose One Cent Sales Tax will provide funds for this expansion which will cost approximately \$110 million.

Findings:

The Grand Jury found all areas inspected to be adequately staffed with exceedingly knowledgeable and professional staff. The facilities were clean and well maintained. Although the jail was overcrowded, the inmates were orderly and were properly supervised and cared for by the staff.

The health facilities were clean and adequately staffed. The health care services are contracted to the WellStar group. Mental health care is provided by Cobb-Douglas Health Services. A dentist is on site, and there is a nurse on site 24/7. High-risk patients at the health unit were adequately cared for and closely supervised.

A facial profile computer system is used for incoming inmates and again used for comparison when they are being released. This assures that the correct person is being released.

The detention facilities were clearly above the originally intended inmate capacity. This inspection revealed a number of inmates using temporary bedding. However, disorder and/or improper care or supervision of the inmate population was not evident due to this overcrowding.

Recommendations:

The facility expansion should be completed in a timely manner to adequately address current and future populations.

The facial profile system should be backed up more often than every ten days, as is current practice. Perhaps, it should be automatically backed up incrementally every day, and totally every 10 days.

The staff of the Cobb County Adult Detention Facility should be commended for their knowledge and professional treatment of the inmates and their excellent service to the citizens of Cobb County.

The July/August Cobb County Grand Jury visited the Cobb County Department of Public Safety Training Academy located at 2109 County Services Parkway on July 25, 2006. The Training Academy has the responsibility of training all Cobb County Police Officers and Firefighters. The purpose of the Grand Jury visit was to observe and evaluate the operation of the Academy.

Committee members were greeted by Major Barry Banks and Terry Martin. Major Banks is responsible for the overall operations of the Academy and Terry Martin is specifically responsible for the training of Cobb County Firefighters. Major Banks escorted the committee members beginning with the Police Academy.

Facilities

Auditorium- The Auditorium can seat around 60 to 100 individuals and is used for instruction and graduations.

Defensive Training Gym- This room can be used to train 15-20 officers and trainees in the art of self-defense.

Classrooms-The Grand Jury was shown one classroom, which could seat around 30 students.

Weapons Training Simulator- The state of the art weapons training simulator allows officers to react to real time situations in the discipline of weapons.

Gym- This is a state of the art gym available for all police officers, firefighters, trainees, and the public.

Library- The library can be described as a large conference room with legal documents and training materials which is used to instruct trainees and staff.

Training

All new Cobb County Police Officers are required to pass a 24 week training schedule. Lateral training is available to Officers from other Georgia jurisdictions. The lateral training is comprised of a shorted 10 week training schedule. All Officers coming from other states are allowed to complete a 12 week course to become a Cobb County Police Officer. In addition to training new Police Officers all current officers are required to attend the Academy to receive additional training each year.

Certified companies are contracted to provide training by qualified instructors for specialized training in addition to training provided by the 10 members of the Academy Staff. In addition the staff of the Academy constantly receives additional training in order to provide the most current relevant training. The training provided to the instructors may be provided out of state.

Special emphasis is placed on training officers to be physically fit in order to get the officers home each night. Lt. Terri Blackmer is responsible for the Para Military training and supervising the 10 self-defense instructors. All Cobb County instructors receive additional training by contracted Master Defense instructors. All trainees receive daily PT to stay physically fit, along with self-defense work with and without weapons. Lt. Blackmer stated an officer may use a firearm in the line of duty, but chances are very great they will be in a fight with a suspect.

We observed additional procedural training in the use of firearms in a classroom setting. It was being used to teach modern police methods. After interacting with the classroom we went on to the weapons simulator. The weapons simulator allows the Officers and Trainees to train with firearms in real life

situations. The simulator was installed about one year ago and all current Cobb County Officers have received training in the simulator. A brief demonstration involving a member of the Grand Jury was conducted and was very impressive. We feel the simulator was well worth the cost.

There were other training facilities that were not observed by the Grand Jury due to time constraints. This included the driving course and the firearms range.

Officers received additional training upon leaving the academy. The new officers ride with a Field Training Officer for a 10 week period and receive daily observation reports. The new officers then drive solo, but receive observation reports for an additional 8 weeks.

We were not able to observe the training process for the firefighters, but Terry Martin and his training staff described the schedule. The firefighters receive training in life-saving techniques and firefighting. Approximately half of the 26 week course is EMT training.

The EMT course is 12 weeks and Cobb County trains for 400 hours vs. the 320 required. HazMat training is required by firefighters and the cadets are taught to be aware, control and help mitigate. After school the trainees train for additional 12 months. During the first 18 months at the station they are required to operate a pump and drive a truck. The trainees are required to move from station to station during the 12 month period for diversity of training.

The academy is responsible for training staff for 27 fire stations with 24 hour shifts. Additional training is coordinated by the academy for current firefighters in the following disciplines:

- Trench Rescue
- Collapsed Building Rescue
- Water Rescue

In conclusion, we discovered the academy is in need of additional facilities including a larger area for self-defense training, a rifle range to train with M-16s. They have made good use of the facilities provided and any additional funds spent on training would be well spent without waste.

911 Center

The Grand Jury was taken to the 911 Center located at Cherokee Street in Marietta. Kathy Strickland met us and took us on a tour of the facility. She stated 110 operators are authorized, but are understaffed by 25 operators. The staff work on 8 hour shifts and receive training in the classroom for 40 hours and then on the job with an observer. There are currently 12 training officers.

The center needs 11 operators and 2 supervisors at a minimum on each shift to function. They need additional operators in order to have breaks. The operators take phone calls and dispatch for most of Cobb County and Marietta. They only dispatch fire for Acworth, Kennesaw, and Powder Springs. Smyrna has its own 911 Center.

The operators have work stations with several monitors that operate and control maps, radios, operation codes, and the telephone. The center receives 500 to 600 calls in the morning and 1200 during the night

and day. The number of calls received increases in the summer when children are out of school. The calls are segregated with operators dedicated for police, sheriff and fire.

The Center has a dedicated back-up generator and a back-up site at the Precinct 1 Police Station in Kennesaw. It takes at least 3 swipes to gain entrance to the facility. They take daily back-ups of phone calls. Phone calls are stored for 3 years in case they are requested for court cases. facility.

The 911 Center will receive a new digital phone system soon in order to remain state-of-the-art.

The committee was impressed with the facility and we believe funds have been utilized appropriately in order to operate the Center.

North Central Georgia Law Enforcement Academy

In accordance with the recommendation of the May-June term of the Cobb County Grand Jury, members of the July-August Cobb County Grand Jury formed a committee to conduct an inspection of the North Central Law Enforcement Academy (NCGLEA). The May-June Grand Jury initially visited the Academy on June 20, 2006 and had some concerns regarding instructor certification and curriculum and training policies and procedures. That committee recommended that the next Grand Jury conduct a more thorough investigation of the training academy. The July-August committee members did meet with personnel from the Sheriff's Office and the North Central Georgia Law Enforcement Academy on July 25, 2006. However, during this meeting, the committee was directed more toward the budget issues of the academy rather than to the issues that were specified in the May-June presentment. (See the attached documents.) As a result, it became apparent to the committee that in order to fully understand the issues that were the concern of the May-June Grand Jury any inspection committee would first need to examine all of the circumstances that surrounded the September 2005 death of a NCGLEA cadet.

Therefore, it is the recommendation of this Grand Jury that the succeeding Cobb County Grand Jury form a committee to inspect the North Central Law Enforcement Academy as recommended by the May-June Grand Jury. However, should the next Grand Jury agree to form such committee, we further recommend that the District Attorney present to that committee the full investigation that was conducted into the death of the academy cadet in September, 2005. It is the belief of this Grand Jury that only after having received that information would the committee understand the reasons for the recommendation of the May/June Grand Jury and then be able to look into the specific areas of concern which prompted the initial recommendation.
