We, the Grand Jury, selected and sworn for the March/April 2007 Term, respectfully make the following presentments:

This Grand Jury has acted on 427 **Indictments**, returning 418 **True Bills** and 9 **No Bills** during the term.

COBB COUNTY GRAND JURY REPORTS

Findings from the Inspections of:

PENAL COMMITTEE

Cobb County Adult Detention Center

Report Summary

The members of the Grand Jury visited this facility on Tuesday, March 20, 2007. We were greeted warmly and treated to a "typical" inmate meal of fish patty, french fries, cole slaw, green beans, salad, cornbread, condiments and pudding. During lunch Chief Deputy Lynda Coker of the Cobb County Sheriff's Department spoke with us. Deputy Chief Coker is extremely knowledgeable and spoke very positively about the Detention Facility. However, when questioned closely by Grand Jury members, several areas of neglect by the citizens and government of Cobb County were apparent.

Foremost is the lack of space. According to the fact sheet of March 2007 given to the Grand Jury, this facility is built to hold 1925 pretrial inmates. Yet, on average daily basis the inmate population is 2542. That is more than 600 inmates over capacity each day. Deputy Chief Coker explained that the Detention Facility must by law take in any person arrested on a warrant; that there is no right of refusal due to overcrowding. Cobb County is slowly working to correct this problem in that ground will be broken this summer to add an 1100 bed expansion funded by a 1% sales tax. This expansion should be open in two and half to three years. If more than 50% of the expansion capacity (600 beds daily) is needed now, clearly this expansion will not be enough.

Secondly, is the nature of the detention environment. Deputy Chief Coker explained that the Sheriff's Department is responsible for many things (serving warrants, transportation of inmates, etc.) few of which are more high risk or dangerous as duty at the detention center. Approximately 30% of the detainees arrive with serious drug abuse or mental health issues causing them to be more violent than the average detainee. Hiring, training and keeping employees is an ongoing problem and the facility is always short of staff. However, repeated requests for higher pay in order to help retain employees have been denied and no other solutions by Cobb County Officials have been offered.

After lunch, Colonel Don Bartlett gave the Grand Jury members a tour of the facility. The "pods" are units where inmates are housed together 23 hours a day. Most detainees are allowed one hour a day of "yard time". The "yard" consists of a concrete floor with a drain in it and 4 story high concrete walls

with concertina wire over the open air roof. There are no tables, chairs, equipment, grass, trees, or anything else in the "yard". The "pods" appear to have been built to hold approximately 40-48 inmates. The ones the Grand Jury viewed clearly had more detainees as there were several mattresses on the floor. The metal table and metal stools were all built into the floor of the "pods".

The Grand Jury was charged with inspecting the sanitation and heating/AC at the detention center. While on the tour of the facility areas we saw appeared to have good sanitation and were at reasonable temperatures for the time of year. When asked specifically if there were sanitation or heating/AC problems that the Grand Jury could help address, Colonel Bartlett said they have Study Teams on site for Medical, Security and Maintenance and that even the Health Department checked things like the temperature of the refrigerators. We have taken that to mean that there are no current problems in the sanitation and heating/AC areas.

Cobb County 911 Center

Report Summary

On Tuesday, March 27, 2007 the members of the Grand Jury had the opportunity to tour the 911 Center. We were greeted by Ann Flynn, Emergency Communications Assistant Director, who conducted our tour.

The Center receives 2-3 thousand phone calls per day. All calls are legitimate, but approximately half of them are true emergencies. There is a need to have 11 Operator positions manned 24/7 to handle the volume. Ideally, they would like to have 14-15 positions manned. Currently, they run three eight hour shifts, but in May they will move to two twelve hour shifts. This will help in their recruiting as well as staff flexibility.

The Center is currently understaffed and in need of nineteen Operators. Full training is provided to new employees and consists of a three-phase training plan, including 40+ hours of classroom training, on the job training, and supervised monitoring. The entire training period takes approximately 6-8 months.

The Center is funded for the most part with monies coming from telephone and cell phone bills. Voice Over I/P services, such as Vonage, currently charge for 911 services, but do not contribute these monies to the 911 centers. There are legislators looking into this. Let's hope our legislators get this money to the Centers that need it. The most recent SPLOST passed for Cobb County will cover upgrades from analog to digital and purchase new equipment.

We would recommend all Grand Jury members tour this facility.

Acworth City Jail

Report Summary

The members of the Grand Jury arrived for an unannounced visit to the Acworth City Jail at 11:50 a.m. on Tuesday, March 27, 2007. After a short wait, female Officer Ferguson led us on our tour. The jail is

staffed by members of the 40+ member Acworth Police Force with always at a minimum of one male and one female on duty. The facility holds 52 inmates maximum, averages 22 inmates and currently is housing 18 inmates.

The inmates are all non-violent offenders, most convicted of misdemeanors or probation violations. The jail has 3 trustees (inmates who have proven trustworthy and thus have more freedom and privileges) who do the laundry and help clean up the kitchen after meals.

We had arrived during lunch and found the office staff and inmates eating the same menu: Hamburgers on buns with lettuce, tomato, onion and pickle, french fries, and fried plantains. We noticed the kitchen rating from the Health Department Inspector was in the high 90's. Aside from the bustle in the kitchen for lunch preparation, the jail was neat and orderly.

The detention cells have room for 4 inmates (there are 4 beds in each, attached to the walls) but currently have 2 to 3 inmates. The cells have TV's and phones, most of which are in working order. Showers are taken in a separate restroom away from the cells. The jail is currently constructing a few new holding cells.

Inmates get an hour of "yard" time per day. The "yard" is a fenced cage (similar to a batting cage) attached to the side of the facility. It has benches for the inmates to sit on and while there is no equipment, at least the inmates have a view of some trees and plants.

The last stop on our tour was a courtroom where the Acworth Police Department holds safety seminars for the citizens of Acworth. It was there that we met another officer on duty, male Sergeant Hunt. Overall, the facility was well run and appeared to be in fairly good shape.

INSPECTION OF THE COBB COUNTY ANIMAL CONTROL FACILITY

Report Summary

On Tuesday, March 27, 2007 the members of the Grand Jury Animal Control Committee met with Debra Cook, Animal Control Manager for an inspection of the Cobb County Animal Control Shelter.

The Animal Control Division is comprised of 43 full-time and 2 part-time Officers. There are 14 Road Officers patrolling.

The Committee was given a complete tour of the facility and it was found to be very clean, organized, and inviting to the public. Ms. Cook answered questions from the committee members. There was some discussion regarding the recent publicity surrounding the issue of euthanasia and the use of gas vs. injection. Ms. Cook was sensitive in her descriptions of both methods. As is often true in many situations, whatever the method used, it must be administered humanely with compassion and dignity for the animal.

If an animal is a stray from another county, that animal needs to be turned into the shelter in the county where it was found. Cobb County has a listing of all surrounding Animal Shelters.

All animals brought into the shelter are inspected and treated for injuries, worms, and given vaccinations. The stray animal will be held for five (5) days before being placed up for adoption. All animals adopted must be spayed or neutered within a specified period of time.

The Committee Members were all very impressed by the dedication of the staff and their handling of the animals. Unfortunately, such a facility is necessary, but it is a safe shelter for animals of all sizes and types to be cared for until a suitable home can be found. We are proud that the Cobb County Animal Control facility is such a place.

COBB COUNTY TAX COMMISSIONER'S OFFICE

Report Summary

On Tuesday, March 27, 2007, a committee from the Grand Jury inspected the office of the Cobb County Tax Commissioner. We were met by Tax Commissioner Gail Downing and given a tour of her facility. In our tour through the public service area, mail room, levy department, and accounting department we were given the opportunity to talk with and ask questions of members of each section. It appeared to this committee that this was a very well run operation with internal controls in place to ensure that monies are properly accounted for. Since this office collects monies for several agencies they are also audited each year by various agencies they collect for to ensure compliance.

COBB COUNTY PARKS AND RECREATION COMMITTEE

Report Summary

On Tuesday, March 27, 2007 members of this committee met with Jimmy Gisi, Director of Cobb County Parks and Recreation and Terrence Ramsey, Division Director.

The Grand Jury Committee learned:

There are 3 divisions of Parks and Recreation

Parks

Recreation

Cultural Affairs (includes Arts Centers)

Funding currently comes from property taxes and Parks and Recreation is currently the 2nd largest department in Cobb County behind Public Safety. During the last election, a bond was passed by voters to purchase more land for parks and currently 70 parcels of land are being reviewed.

There are currently 65 properties covering 5001 acres. There are 198 full-time staffers and 449 part-time staffers. There are 18-20,000 children involved in county athletics and 5 full-time staffers handle all registrations. There are 6 Aquatic Centers (4 in-door and 2 out-door). They have the largest tennis program in the metro area with 112 tennis courts.

Process for Youth Athletics Programs:

Non-profit groups that wish to start a league have to:

- 1) Have a Board of Directors
- 2) Provide By-Laws- including cost
- 3) Provide proof of Insurance
- 4) Be a unique (not already existing) program

Cobb County provides facilities for youth athletics, but not funding. By-laws from leagues have to be submitted and approved by Parks and Recreation. Board has to provide equipment, uniforms, referees, and concession stands. By-laws should include scholarship opportunities.

Basketball court and field conditions were highlighted as being in bad condition for the very, very few that we have. Parks and Recreation is aware and money from recent SPLOST is going to repairs.

Lights being left on when parks are closed.

Recommendations

- 1) Parent Bill of Rights-handed to parents at registration-outlining scholarship opportunities and Board Responsibilities and By-laws of Board
- 2) Same information as above provided on Internet/Websites of teams
- 3) Cobb County lacks Basketball Courts. The ratio between basketball courts and/or football, tennis, and baseball courts are nil to none. Maybe we can turn some tennis courts into basketball courts and get repairs done to current ones.
- 4) Making sure we control costs where necessary such (for example: lights being left on when parks are closed.
