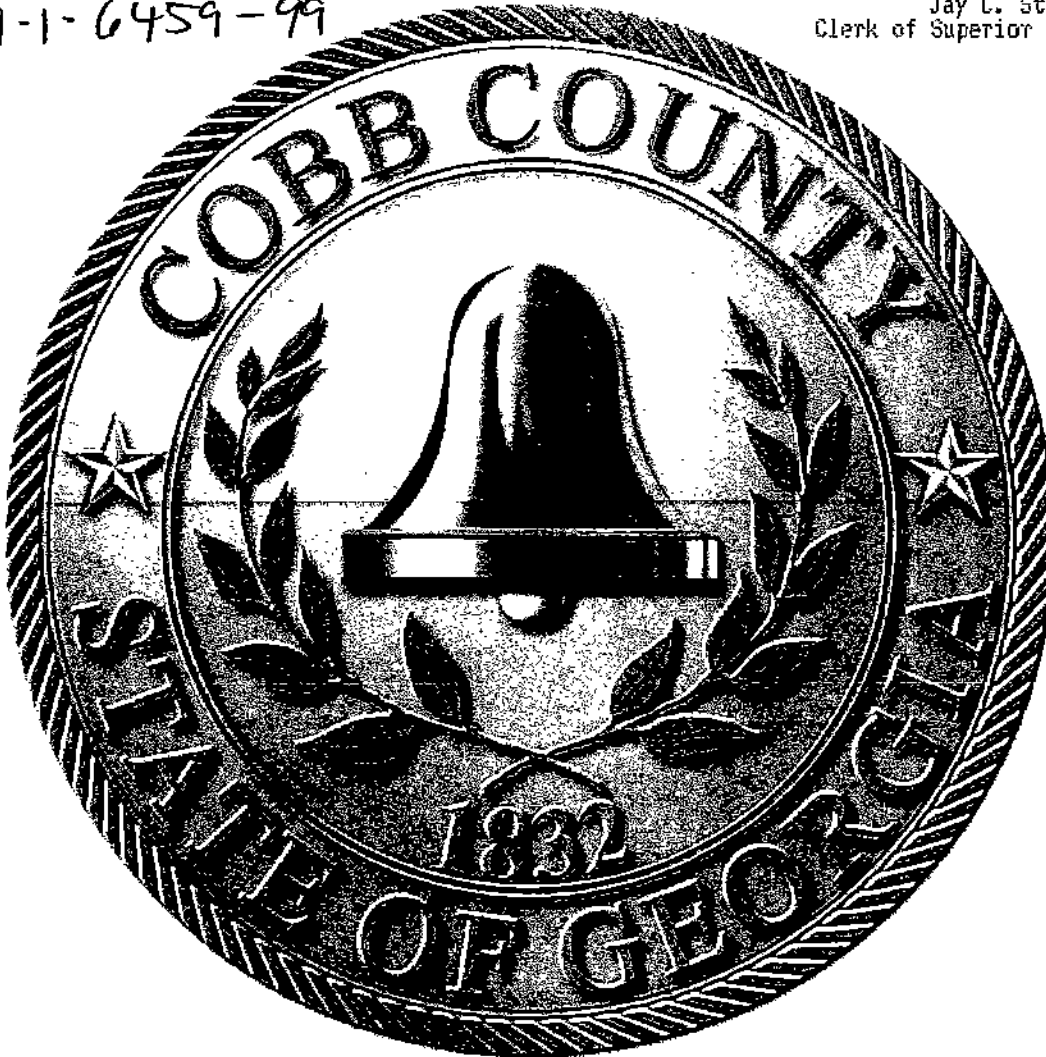

## **GRAND JURY PRESENTMENTS**

We, the Grand Jury, selected and sworn for the July/August 2009 Term, respectfully make the following presentments:

This Grand Jury has acted on **404 Indictments**, returning **390 True Bills** and **14 No Bills** during the term.

## **COBB COUNTY GRAND JURY REPORTS**

*Findings from the Inspections of:*

### **Cobb County Adult Detention Center**

On July 21, 2009 members of the July/August 2009 Term Grand Jury had lunch and a tour of the Adult Detention Center.

The reception area of the newly completed Administration Building was large, open and according to Colonel Lew Alder, non-secured. Lunch was served in the "Muster Room" and during lunch Chief Lynda Coker gave a presentation.

Tour of the secured facilities included the intake area, infirmary, inmate "pods", work release, and work crew area, as well as the visitor center. The intake area processes over 100 people each day and utilizes fingerprints and facial recognition at intake and before releasing an inmate.

All areas containing inmates have barriers to impede entrance and exit. "A-pod" holds male inmates that require the highest level of security. "B-pod" houses all female inmates regardless of their level of offense. All pods are arranged so that the guards have visible contact with inmates at all times and direct contact every hour.

The infirmary houses all inmates who need medical or psychiatric attention. They work in unison with WellCare to provide prompt medical attention at significant savings to the taxpayers. Individual rooms held either single or several male inmates. In one of these rooms, 6 female inmates were placed together.

The work-release, while still secure, is a barracks type arrangement. The inmates live in large, well-lit "halls" and are monitored by video cameras and "catwalks" above the rooms.

The new visitor center is a clean, well-lit building in which, by appointment, visitors can meet with inmates through video conferencing. There are private

rooms where attorneys can video conference with their clients. Another large room allows citizens to watch court proceedings of the inmates.

### **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- 1) Look at ways to reduce the number of female inmates sharing a room in the infirmary
- 2) Replace the broken floor tiles throughout the facility as they present a hazard to both staff and inmates.

### **COBB 911**

The July/August 2009 Grand Jury visited the Cobb County 911 facility on July 17, 2009.

Members of the Grand Jury found this facility to be very impressive and well equipped to serve the citizens of Cobb County.

### **Cobb County Penal Committee**

On July 28, 2009, the Marietta Regional Youth Detention Center (RYDC) and the Kennesaw Jail were visited by the July/August Grand Jury Committee. Below are the facts and observations regarding each facility.

#### **Marietta RYDC**

##### **General Facts:**

- o Total Capacity is 70 inmates (60 male; 10 female)
- o Current occupancy as of 7/28/09 is 59 inmates (48 male; 11 female)
- o Facility serves both pre-trial and punitive detention
- o Inmate age range from 12-17 years of age

By design, the facility resembles a school building. Inmates keep a 6 period school schedule in order to stay on track with educational requirements. The classrooms are clean and well organized. All teachers are state certified by subject. The facility has a new 10-station educational computer lab for student use.

The medical center has 3 medical exam rooms and 1 dental room. The facility has on-site medical care, however; dental care is brought in on an as-needed basis.

##### **Areas of Improvement and Recommendations:**

The school library is very small. Inmates could benefit from a greater availability of reading material.

The recreational area contained numerous televisions with loose cabling and unsecured equipment. This area could be potentially hazardous to the inmates. Such area would benefit from improved cable management and security hardware.

The outdoor recreational area has a large metal drain in the middle of the playing field. Because of the location of the drain, this too could be quite hazardous. It is recommended that a plan be developed in order to reduce risk.

The mental health and drug counseling programs have been significantly reduced due to state funding cuts. It is recommended that these programs be re-instated as they have a significant impact on the inmates.

### **Kennesaw Jail**

#### **General Facts:**

- o Total Capacity is 50 inmates (26 Beds)
- o Occupancy at time of visit is 13 inmates
- o Facility can hold 10 female inmates
- o Facility serves both pre-trial and punitive detention

The Kennesaw Jail has one intake cell in which inmates can stay for 4 to 6 hours. Afterwards, inmates are either bonded out or transferred to main cells. Inmates are given a medical screening on intake and doctors are available on an as-needed basis.

Due to the short length of stay, no educational resources are provided to the inmates. Additionally, there are not any mental health or substance abuse counseling programs. However, AA and faith-based services hold regularly scheduled programs at the facility.

### **Cobb County Department of Public Safety Training Academy**

On July 28, 2009, the Grand Jury toured the Cobb County Public Safety Training Academy. The Academy is a training facility for recruits and veterans of the Fire and Police Departments of Cobb County. The officers must have advanced and annual training to maintain their certification. The Academy also offers several opportunities for the public to become more involved in the community with the Citizens Public Safety Academy and the Citizens Emergency Response Team, also known as CERT. In September 2009, the Citizens Public Safety Academy will begin and is a 10-week course offering a chance to learn about firearms, the police department, the 911 Emergency Management Center, and additional County entities.

A discussion was held of the many different types of training given to both recruits and veteran officers, which far exceeds the State of Georgia standards. The Grand Jury members split up into groups to observe the firing range, the computerized driving simulator, and the emergency vehicle driving center.

The Academy strives to maintain a quality of excellence in standards and the number of hours required to fulfill these standards far exceeds the State of Georgia requirements. The Cobb County Law Enforcement Officers are trained and held to these superior standards. The Grand Jury would like to thank the Academy for the opportunity to tour their facility and also thank the staff for all their hard work. We did notice while in the training room that there were puddles on the stage from active leaks in the ceiling.

### **RECOMMENDATIONS**

To review and take necessary action to repair leaks in the training room.

### **Cobb County Medical Examiner's Office Committee**

On July 28, 2009 the July/August Grand Jury committee visited the Cobb County Medical Examiner's Office. Such facility is located less than 100 yards from the Cobb County 911 facility. The ME's Office is easily over-looked as it resembles a small doctor's office. The total site location measures a mere **3758 square feet**. Upon entering the location, the committee immediately noticed a mild foul odor hovering throughout the dimly lit reception area. Shortly thereafter, we were greeted by Mike Cospers, the Operations Manager who served as our tour guide.

The tour began with the front portion of the building which consisted of a lobby, cramped office spaces shared by forensic technicians and investigators, the conference room which also served as additional office space, break-room and the vault also known as the evidence storage closet. This portion of the building was constructed in 1983.

Then, Mr. Cospers directed the committee to the back of the facility which consisted of the lab and morgue. This is the original portion of the facility which was constructed in 1979. While touring the lab, we were able to view an actual autopsy. Mr. Cospers indicated that a typical autopsy can take anywhere from 1.0 to 1.5 hours to complete. The lab measuring only **288 square feet** barely allows for 2 autopsies to be done simultaneously. However, if the case is part of a criminal investigation, then only one autopsy can be conducted at a time. We concluded with a brief tour of the morgue.

Mr. Cospers further explained that the facility had only one ventilation system which allows the air from the lab to circulate throughout the rest of the building-hence the foul odor we experienced upon our arrival. The space limited facility also did not have an adequate room for bereaved families visiting the office to find the results of an autopsy.

The tour conducted by Mr. Mike Cospers was very educational, thorough and enlightening. However, we were not impressed with the confines of the facility. Fortunately, when Mr. Cospers requested information from Dekalb County, they extended an invitation to the Grand Jury committee to tour their Medical Examiner's Office facility. This Grand Jury committee visited the Dekalb County Medical Examiner's Office two weeks later.

Dekalb County is one of the larger counties just above Cobb. On average, Dekalb performs a mere 300 more cases than Cobb County per year (Dekalb County averages between 1500-1700 cases annually). Upon arriving at the M.E.'s Office in Dekalb we were taken aback by their sprawling three (3) building campus measuring **19,000 square feet versus Cobb's 3758 square foot building**. As we entered the lobby, the committee immediately noticed a well lit, odorless environment. We were greeted by our tour guides Pat Bailey (Chief Investigator) and Paul Kelhofer (Medical Director).

The campus consisted of an administration building which housed offices for the Director, Chief Investigator, Operations/Forensic Manager and various other administrative staff and doctors. The second building was the lab which not only housed the autopsy lab measuring **1600 square feet**, but also included but not limited to various offices for the forensic technicians, a histology lab, receiving and outgoing morgues and a separate lab for decomposed subjects. The Technical Body Recovery Building was the final facility visited. Important Note: Each building had its own ventilation system.

#### **Recommendation:**

The July/August Grand Jury recommends immediate local funding to plan, design and construct a facility similar to the Dekalb County Medical Examiner's campus.

#### **Cobb County Code Enforcement Committee**

#### **Department Overview:**

Since 1972, countywide zoning has been in effect. They are responsible for responding, investigating and resolving complaints on personal property regarding zoning, signage, house moving and solid waste ordinances to mention a few. The county, divided into nine (9) zones and several sub-zones has several field workers working in each of the areas.

In 2007, a law was enacted defining "dwelling unit" parameters; 390 square feet of total building space is required per each adult living in the dwelling.

In 2008, the department introduced Acella, a new computer program offering citizens access to report/file and follow progress of complaints, while offering field workers wireless access to case information. This allows more time to investigate and resolve complaints proactively in the field, even printing a citation while at the address and leaving it. Acella has reduced the amount of paperwork as the information entered in the field goes back to the office. The information available to the public on the County's website states the date and time of the follow-up visit and the officer's name allowing some to correct violations before they arrive. The department is considering adding some early morning hours (4AM) to try to catch offenders off guard and hopes new resources will become available to add more officers.

**Questions by the Grand Jury:**

How many people can occupy a residence?

The number of vehicles allowed to park regularly or overnight?

What qualifies as defined living area and how square footage can be changed with the Tax Assessor's Office, allowing for more occupants in a residence?

**Answers by Code Enforcement Officials:**

In a single-family dwelling 390 square feet of the total building square feet is required for each adult occupant, none for children. No more than one vehicle per 390 square feet can be parked regularly overnight, majority of nights in any 7-day period. One business vehicle under 12,500 lbs. gross weight allowed if used exclusively by an occupant of the residence. Defined living areas must have water, heat, a bathroom and kitchen facilities permanently installed and a way to escape such as a window or door. Notarized letters requested by the County ask both property owner and the occupants of the residence to provide information on how many people live at the address and the number of cars including registration information. Both Mr. Hosack and Ms. Tatum stated that along with the early morning hours added, a picture could help show that the parking issues reoccur after the officer has left the follow-up visit.

Right now, a resident can go to the Tax Assessor's Office and increase the square footage of their house without any required documents, such as a building permit or a certificate of occupancy. A group of concerned residents that have reported violations pertaining to the number of occupants in dwellings in their neighborhood, have suggested to the Code Enforcement Department that in order to verify that the square footage has actually been changed, proof of a building permit or certificate of occupancy be mandatory before the records be changed. The Department is considering changing the code per the suggestion, when asked how soon this could take place they were not sure.


